In Pakistan, violence against children is widespread and socially acceptable in a number of forms. The incidences of violent discipline, child labour, child















STUDY:

Birth Registration:


Pakistan is estimated to have some of the lowest birth registration rates in the world (about 1 in 3 parents say that they have not registered the birth of any of their children) which is a factor of violence because it provides children with a verifiable legal identity, is often a prerequisite for access to various social services in the country, and is a passport to protection for children.



Child Labour:
